

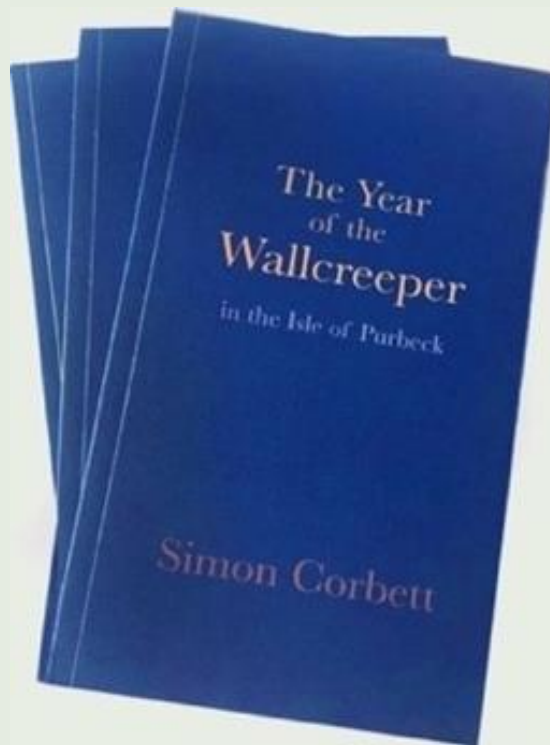


My father was a keen birdwatcher and member of the Purbeck Ornithological Club which met at Leeson House in Langton Matravers throughout the 1970's. Fellow members included Bunny Teagle, Margaret Leach, Rees Cox, Trev Haysom and Helen Brotherton - founder of the Dorset Wildlife Trust.

Dad wrote about his birdwatching experiences which he edited into the shape of a diary which our family published in 2006. Reading it again during lockdown reminded me of winter days' parked-up on Portland sitting in the back of a steamed-up car with my brothers and seeing bearded tits among the reeds at Radipole. Of family walks and picnics on Arne heath, surrounded by heather, looking for Marsh Gentians, watching Dartford Warblers flitting amongst the gorse and dad counting long-legged and long-billed waders prodding their curved beaks into the mud flats around the bay.

Descriptions of guillemots, razorbills and puffins soaring over the sea, flying too and from the cliff ledges. The Wallcreeper and the hoards of twitchers it brought to the area in 1971. Of Yellowhammers, Song Thrushes, Blackcaps and the many songbirds that he enjoyed watching at Winspit, Seacombe and Chapmans Pool their valleys abundant with autumn berries.

Dad's record captures the great variety of species he and his friends saw in Purbeck reflecting both his passion for the subject and richness of the area.
