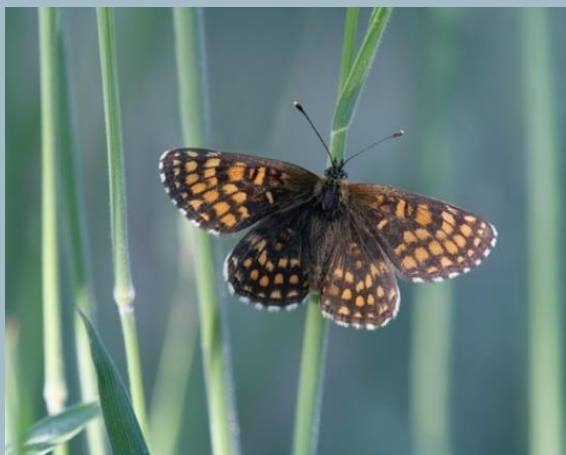




Hockley Woods
